

GARDEN STATE PAINT HORSE CLUB  
April 6, 2009

The meeting was called to order at 7:50 PM, by the President, Marjorie Moser, at the Woodstown Diner. **TREASURER'S REPORT:** John Moser reported a balance on hand of \$10,496.00. He also noted that the Dream Park has received the insurance to cover all of our shows there this year.

**GSPHC JR. PAINT SHOW:** Marjorie reported that the Junior Club has received their approval from APHA to hold a Paint show in July.

**GSPHC JR. YOUTH CLINIC:** Ken Ware reported that the clinic was well received. Marjorie reported that Debbie Jones, a Club member who attended the clinic, had e-mailed her noting how well run the clinic was.

**APHA CORRESPONDENCE:** Ken Ware reported the following:

- Several variances have been OK'd by APHA due to the current economic situation.
- All horses shown in the Three Year Old Snaffle Bit Classes must be shown in a snaffle bit.

**APHA DIRECTORS:** Marjorie reported that she had received correspondence from APHA reminding all clubs that Alternate APHA Directors must attend one APHA meeting each year.

**PINTO INFORMATION:** Julie Bishop reported that any regular registered Paint horse can now get their Pinto papers upon submission of a copy of their Paint papers, pictures, and the appropriate fee.

**NJ STATE REPORT:** Julie Bishop reported that the 2009/2010 State budget for non-racing breeds (which includes our Jersey Bred money) has been raised from \$7,500 last year to \$25,000 this year.

**JERSEY BRED MONEY:** John Moser reported that there is one person who has not yet cashed their Jersey Bred check.

**ALL BREED SHOW MEETING:** Julie Bishop reported that the All Breed Show Committee will be holding a meeting on April 15 to discuss the future format of the All Breed Show. Motion was made (Julie Bishop/Munn) and passed that, if we will be able to hold a lesser number of classes at the All Breed Show and still receive the same amount of All Breed show prize money, that the extra monies from the show that would be made available to our Club, be added to our Jersey Bred Year End monies.

**JERSEY BRED ALL BREED SHOW:** If we will have 13 classes at the All Breed Show, as we have had in the past, then we will hold the same classes as last year. If we can have less than 13 classes, and still receive the same amount of money, the motion made in the previous paragraph will stand. These classes would be: Weanlings (both sexes), All Age Mares, All Age Stallions and Geldings, All Age Trail, Longe Line, Junior English, Junior Western, Senior English, Senior Western.

**YOUTH CLUB REPORT:** Cyndy Hetzell reported the following:

- The recent Youth Clinic was quite successful. There were 22 participants and the clinic was held indoors.
- The Youth Club has received the show variance from APHA for their July Paint show.
- There will be a Fitting for Halter program held at Debbie Kinney's next Tuesday.

**EQUINE ADVISORY BOARD REPORT:** Barbara Mantini reported that she has information from the EAB about the current Waste Management Guidelines which will have to be met with the next 36 months.

**APRIL HORSE SHOW:**

- Shavings - Barbara has gotten a price of \$6/large bale (he will deliver them to the stalls and take back any leftovers) from Coleman's. Jane will get a price from Les Vierck tomorrow. If Les' price is \$5.00 or less we will use him.

- Early arrivals - Anyone arriving before noon on Friday will be charged \$125/stall. The Dream Park charges us \$100.00 if horses come on the grounds before noon on Friday plus \$25/stall.
- The Comfort Station (restroom/shower) building has not yet been constructed.
- The "drop down" sides have not yet arrived for the stalls.

JULY SHOW: Mike Ochetto's son will also be one of our ring stewarts.

GSPHC DIRECTOR: Judy Moyer has resigned her position as one of our GSPHC directors. Marjorie appointed Julie Bishop to fill that position.

JACKPOT CLASSES: Motion was made (Ware/Nolasco) and passed that the "office fee" for the Jackpot Classes will be 10% of the original entry fee. Motion was made (Kensler/Ware) and passed that the money payouts be rounded to the nearest dollar.

FUTURITIES: Debbie Kinnery reported the following:

- A Bake/Basket sale will be held at the April show with the profits to be split between the Youth Club and the Futurities.
- The Futurity Committee is selling 500 \$5.00 raffle tickets with the winning ticket to be drawn at the September show. The winner will receive their choice of either \$500 cash or a work saddle.
- The Futurity Committee has made the following monies to date: \$480.00 at the Woodstown Supply bake sale, \$100 at the Partylite home party, \$150 from the cookie tray auction at the Awards Banquet.
- At this time there is \$1,808.00 in the Futurity account.

SUNSHINE CLUB 50/50: This was won tonight by Steve Bleifuss.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 PM with the next regular meeting date set for Monday, September 14, 2009.
