

GARDEN STATE PAINT HORSE CLUB
November 1, 2010

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 PM by the President, Marjorie Moser, at the home of Dorothy Quirk. In attendance were: Mary Kensler, Margie Moser, Barbara Mantini, Jane Munn, Cyndy Hetzell, Sigrid Ware, Ken Ware, Patti Cerio, Dorothy Quirk, Lisa Bork.

MINUTES: Dorothy Quirk read a synopsis of the October minutes.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mary Kensler reported a balance on hand of \$34,352.00. She gave an amended profit from the September horse show of \$6,800.00. Mary noted that Marjorie's Convention hotel bill and Ken Ware's Convention hotel and airfare bills have not yet been paid. Motion was made (S. Ware/Munn) and approved to accept Mary's treasurer's report.

YEAR END BANQUET: Marjorie reported that Scott Jackson, representing APHA, would be attending our Banquet.

NJ HORSE COUNCIL: Motion was made (Hetzell/K. Ware) and passed that GSPHC renew their membership in the NJ Horse Council for the sum of \$100.00.

YOUTH REPORT: Cyndy Hetzell reported the following:

- The Youth Club is selling APHA tractor raffle tickets. For each \$50 ticket that is sold, the Youth Club will be able to retain \$25.00. Motion was made (K. Ware/Moser) and passed that GSPHC purchase two tickets in the Club's name for an undetermined use if we win.
- The Club's Community Service at this time is to collect new pillows and make blankets to be donated to the Battered Women's Shelter. The pillows can be brought to the Awards Banquet or given to any GSPHC Youth Club member.
- The Club will be participating in the Bridgeton Christmas Parade.

JERSEY BRED: Barbara Mantini, EAB representative, reported that there were 11 Jersey Bred Paints shown at the September GSPHC show. At \$140/horse, that will give GSPHC \$1,540.00 to distribute among their Jersey Bred Paints. Breeds who chose to show their Jersey Breds at the show held at the Horse Park only receive \$70/horse. This is due to the fact that breeds showing at their own breed

shows do not incur any horse show expenses for the State e.g. judges fees, show grounds rental, etc. The last Jersey Bred show to be held at the Horse Park of NJ will be in 2011. There will be no Jersey Bred show in 2012.

GSPHC will reimburse each owner of the two Jersey Bred Superior horses for two tickets to the EAB Awards Banquet.

Julie Bishop, Jersey Bred Chairperson, will bring her recommendations for any Jersey Bred rule changes to the December meeting for discussion at that time.

AWARDS BANQUET: Jane Munn reported that everything has been taken care of in preparation for the banquet. There will be a baked goods raffle to benefit the Club.

GSPHC HORSE SHOWS: Motion was made (Quirk/Cerio) and passed that the Western Riding, Reining, Pole Bending, and Barrel classes be held as the last classes on Saturday at the April Paint show.

VERSATILITY CLASSES: These classes will again be held at the September Paint show. The sponsor monies raised in 2010 are being held for this event in 2011.

SPONSORSHIPS: Barbara Mantini will contact the Hampton Inn (our host hotel) to see if they would offer us a sponsorship in 2011.

SHAVINGS: Bill Davis will handle the shavings trailer again in 2011. We will add Bill's ad to our website since he is sponsoring this work.

IN HAND TRAIL: Jane Munn reported that she has access to a \$250 donation to this class if we offer it at our show. Adding this to our show program will be discussed at the December meeting.

CROSS-OVER FEES: Anyone who has any suggestions for cross-over fee pricings, send them to Dorothy Quirk (quirk463@comcast.net). She will compile the suggestions and present them to the membership at the December meeting.
