

GARDEN STATE PAINT HORSE ASSOCIATION

October 3, 2005

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 PM, by the President, Marjorie Moser, at the Malaga Diner. TREASURER'S REPORT: John Moser reported a balance on hand of \$21,165.00. John noted that the following horse show bills are still outstanding: showgrounds rental, rental of the Fairgrounds stalls, shavings, judges' motel rooms, and secretarial fees, which would amount to approximately \$10,000.00.

The following bill was presented for payment:

Ken Ware: \$735.00 - airfare and motel for the APHA Convention
Motion was made (Kensler/Munn) and passed that the above bill be paid.

CORRESPONDENCE: A thank you note was received from Mr. and Mrs. Jirkowsky, September show judges, noting that our show was very well run. This note will be printed on the website and in the newsletter.

SHOW COMMITTEE REPORT: It was noted that there are errors with the show results on the website. It is noted, on the website, that any errors are to be sent to Jane Munn. Motion was made (Meade/Munn) and passed that the individual placings from the September show, which are posted on the website at this time, be removed. Jane Munn's condensed points, which are also posted, will be left.

RIBBONS: Jane Munn reported that she has counted the ribbons and Lloyd will place the 2006 order.

YOUTH CLUB: The GSPHC Youth Club Newsletter will be added to the website. They will be holding their next meeting on Friday, October 14, at the Hetzell home. Cyndy thanked Debbie Kinney for her donation of a Breeding Stock to the Youth Club. The Breeding Stock Raffle was won by Lorraine Castellini.

NEWSLETTER: Sigrid reported that she is mailing 45 newsletters at this time. It was noted that the newsletter mailings need to be mailed in a more timely manner. The dates for mailings will be: April 1, June 1, September 1,

October 1, and either January 15 or February 1. Motion was made (Kensler/J. Moser) and passed that the next newsletter be mailed October 10. Any information to be included in that newsletter must be received by Sigrid in a timely manner.

JERSEY BRED: Julie Bishop reported that she plans on having the points completed within a week. The points will then be posted on the website and included in the next newsletter. She has found no discrepancies to date.

BIF FUTURITY/REPLACEMENT FUTURITY: Debbie Kinney presented some tentative rules that she would like to propose. She will have more information on her plans for a Replacement Futurity for the BIF at the next meeting.

END OF YEAR AWARDS: Jane Munn reported that she needs the points published so they can be checked before she can do any ordering. Motion was made (Kensler/Meade) and passed that the 2005 Awards Budget be set at \$5,000.00, with a maximum cap of \$5,500.00.

AWARDS BRUNCH: Jane reported that she will have a flyer published in the near future.

NJ SUPERIOR CHAMPION AWARDS: Julie Bishop reported that she has had two applications turned in:

Diane Harrell's "Socket of Gold"

Julie Bishop's "Justa Splash of White"

GOLD CLUB CERTIFICATE: Barbara Mantini sent word that she picked up our Gold Club Certificate (good for five years) at the Convention.

EAB EQUESTRIAN OF THE YEAR: Barbara Mantini also sent word that she has received a resume from Allie Sharp. Ashley Nolasco and Larissa Karman are also interested in competing.

APHA CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS: Ken Ware reported that the following items were passed at the APHA Convention:

- It will be mandatory that shows offer the following Breeding Stock Classes: two mare classes, two gelding classes, and two performance classes.
- Frozen semen can now be shipped from a stallion after he is gelded.

- Trail Class Scoring: an incorrect lead will be a disqualification, infractions e.g. bucking, rearing, etc. will be -5 points.
- Top 20 Horses: do not have to show under 20 different judges.
- Amateurs can now show University owned horses.
- Youths do not have to send in their birth certificates to APHA anymore.
- Breeding Stock horses will now be referred to as "Solid Paint Bred".
- They are adding Maiden Halter Classes.

Convention discussion was held about possibly making the World Show a Qualifying Show, earning no APHA points.

2006 SHOW COMMITTEE: Jane Munn reported the Committee recommends:

- Offering Breeding Stock classes for half price. Motion was made (J. Moser/Kensler) and passed.
- The Crossover Fee will be half price. Motion was made (J. Moser/K. Ware) and passed.
- The Saturday July Showday will begin at 7:00 AM. Motion was made (K. Ware/Kinney) and passed.

Recommendations made for the July show were:

- To announce the winners after they are excused to the lower end of the show ring.
- Make sure that all patterns are short and quick, but not necessarily easy.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:55 PM with the next regular meeting date set for November 7, 2005.
