

GARDEN STATE PAINT HORSE CLUB
February 7, 2011

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 by the President, Marjorie Moser, at the home of Milton and Dorothy Quirk. In attendance were: Debbie Kinney, Judy Moyer, Barb Mantini, Ashley Nolasco, Jane Munn, Cyndy Hetzell, Marjorie Moser, Chris Ferrell, Ken Ware, Glenn Gieschen, Lisa Bork, Patti Cerio, Dorothy Quirk, Mary Kensler.

MINUTES: Prior to the acceptance of the January minutes, Dorothy Quirk read a synopsis of the minutes to the membership.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mary Kensler reported a balance on hand of \$29,244.00. She noted that there are still a few outstanding bills from the September show. Motion was made (Munn/Ware) and passed to pay the following bill:

- Mary Kensler: \$75.00 - envelopes and stamps for mailing 1099 forms
- Mary reported that she had received a \$175.00 check from APHA which was our Club's profit from selling the APHA Rustler tickets. This amount was, in turn, given to the GSPHC Youth Club since the ticket sales were a GSPHC Youth Club fundraising project.

GSPHC YOUTH CLUB: Cyndy Hetzell reported the following:

- The Club will be holding their Youth Clinic again this year.
- They have applied to APHA for a "Paint for a Day Show" where APHA pays all the show expenses.

APHA DIRECTORS: This year we will have both a Director and Alternate up for election. An APHA Directors' Nomination Form was circulated so that anyone interested in these positions could sign up.

NJ EQUINE ADVISORY BOARD: Barbara Mantini reported the following:

- 2011 will be the last year that the Jersey Bred show will be held at the Horse Park.
- Maria Grasso represented GSPHC at the EAB Queen Competition.
- Both Judy Moyer and Glen Gieschen attended the EAB Banquet.

GSPHC MEMBERSHIP FORM: The new GSPHC membership form will have both the GSPHC membership form and the GSPHC Youth form on the same page.

CASINO AND POKER TOURNAMENT (including a roast beef dinner): Debbie Kinney, Chairperson, reported the following:

- The date has been changed to May 7, 2011, from 6:00 - 11:00 PM
- GSPHC will need to purchase a NJ State raffle license for \$100 which is good for 2 years. We will also need to purchase a Township raffle license for \$100.00.
- The Salem County Sportsman's Club has reduced our rental fee to \$100.00.
- Lapp's Catering will provide dinner. Food will be available throughout the evening.
- Motion was made (Quirk/Kensler) and passed to hire Royal Flush Entertainment to conduct the Casino Night for the fee of \$2,700.00.
- Debbie reported that she has already secured \$1,500 in sponsor money. Table sponsors are available for \$250.00 and the sponsor will be entitled to a 12 month advertisement on our website and at our shows and be permitted to display their banner at any of the GSPHC functions.
- She estimates that the Club should realize a minimum profit of \$4,500.00.
- Only 120 tickets will be sold.
40 will be Casino tickets (including dinner): \$50.00
80 will be for the Poker Tournament (including dinner): \$75.00
- There will also be a basket raffle. All GSPHC Directors and members are requested to donate baskets to this fundraiser. Baskets can be given to Debbie at the March or April GSPHC meetings or brought to the show office during the April GSPHC Show.

SHOW COMMITTEE: Dorothy Quirk went over the recommendations from the Show Committee meeting held January 10, 2011. Discussion was held on each recommendation.

- The revised GSPHC membership form was distributed and accepted. A copy will be posted on the website.
- GSPHC was incorporated in 1973 and was the 43rd Paint Club in the USA.
- Motion was made (Moyer/Munn) and passed to add In Hand Trail to the show program. At the April, July, and September shows only Open In Hand Trail will be offered. At the September show there will be both an Open and Non Pro In Hand Trail Futurity.
- Cross over fees: there will be no change for 2011.
- A new, simplified entry form was accepted for 2011.

- Motion was made (Munn/Mantini) and passed that the start time for all GSPHC shows be 7:00 AM.
- Versatility Classes: this was tabled until the March or April meeting.
- Exhibitor Dinner: Motion was made (Kensler/Gieschen) and passed to hold an Exhibitor Dinner on the Friday evening of the April show. A chicken dinner will be provided by our sponsor, Lapp's Catering, for \$6.00. These will be packaged in take-out containers and will be available after 6:00 Friday night. There will be one free dinner ticket given with each stall rented. Additional dinners can be ordered with stall reservations and up to one week prior to the show for the cost of \$8.00. Cyndy Hetzell will print the tickets.
- Scribing Clinic: Judy Moyer will hold this during the Youth Clinic.
- Ring Configuration: It was agreed to keep the ring larger (as it was at the September show) and have a smaller make-up pen.
- Farm House Embroidery: Motion was made (Moyer/Nolasco) and passed that the digitized, embroidered denim jacket or stall front donated by Farm House Embroidery be used as a drawing. Every horse that places "out of the points" in each class will have their back number placed on a ticket and entered in the drawing for this \$200 item.
- Pattern books: Judy Moyer and Jane Munn will coordinate these.
- GSPHC sweatshirts: Barbara Mantini will order these as soon as she receives Melissa Ilic's design that was chosen at the Show Committee meeting.
- Futurities: Chairperson - Glenn Gieschen
Glen reported that he has not decided on the awards or merchandise that will be used for the Futurities. Futurity classes are:
 1. Yearling Stallion - halter
 2. Yearling Mares - halter
 3. Yearling Geldings - halter
 4. Non-Pro Halter - all sexes
 5. Weanling fillies - halter
 6. Weanling Stallions and Geldings - halter
 7. Non Pro Halter - all sexes
 8. Two Year Old Hunter Under Saddle
 9. Two Year Old Western Pleasure
 10. Three/Four Year Old Hunter Under Saddle
 11. Three/Four Year Old Western Pleasure

12. Non Pro Hunter Under Saddle - all ages

13. Non Pro Western Pleasure - all ages

14. Open Yearling Longe Line

15. Non Pro Yearling Longe Line

16. Yearling Trail In Hand

17. Non Pro Trail In Hand

- 2010 April show: This show was rated the #14th highest APHA show in the nation in number of entries.
- Adult Walk-Trot Class Request: A request was read requesting that we add Adult Walk Trot to our 2011 show schedule. This was tabled until the 2012 show season.
- Request to make showing in halter a requirement: A request was received requiring horses to show in a halter class in order to qualify for a GSPHC Show High Point award. It was noted that we did this several years ago and found very little difference in our halter class participation. Barbara Mantini stated that the office staff had numerous exhibitors who took offense that they were required to show their riding horses in halter classes. GSPHC has chosen not to use the same rules, and is not required to do so, for their show high points as APHA does.

GSPHC SCRAPBOOK AND GOLD STAR REQUIREMENTS: Judy Moyer and Melissa Ilic will handle this for the Club.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:35 PM with the next regularly scheduled meeting set for March 7, 2010, at the home of Dorothy Quirk. The membership meeting will begin at 7:30. Anyone wishing to come and eat prior to the meeting may do so at 7:00 compliments of Debbie Kinney.
